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## **Second "Cohort" of Doctoral Students Begin Their Studies**

The second group (cohort) of doctoral students enrolled in the Ph.D. and Ed.D. programs in counseling started doctoral courses in August of 2002. This represents the second "cohort" admission to the doctoral program. Previously there was a rolling admission procedure allowing admissions several times a year. Now all prospective doctoral students must apply by January of the year they desire admission, and then, if admitted, they must start coursework in August with the other newly admitted doctoral students. The "cohort" method of admission is designed to maximize doctoral student interaction and comradery. It also allows for optimized course sequencing to ensure that doctoral students make progress in their degrees in an orderly way. It is projected that tuition will increase a minimum of 10% per year over the next several years due to lack of state support just to keep the University operational (no big raises for personnel). 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### **New Faculty Join Division of Counseling & Family Therapy**

The Division of Counseling & Family Therapy welcomes **Dr. Lela Kosteck Bunch and Dr. Dawn S. Szymanski** to our faculty. These are two outstanding professors whom you will want to get to know.

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**Lela Kosteck Bunch, PhD, LPC, NCC**, is a new addition to our faculty in the School Counseling area. Dr. Bunch brings a wide range of experiences to her new position.

Dr. Bunch has been an educator for over 27 years, teaching English, French, Physical Education, Health, and Driver's Ed. In addition, she has 14 years counseling experience, both at the elementary level and at the secondary level, including comprehensive high school counseling and special needs/at risk counseling, with five additional years of experience in the delivery of psychological services as a psycho-educational consultant. Dr. Bunch has also worked as a supervisor of adult education, after completing vocational supervision certification from the MCTTA Leadership Academy. She has worked in all facets of education at virtually all levels (K-12) and has an excellent vocational repertoire of skills.

For the past three years Dr. Bunch served as the Director of Guidance and Placement for the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. During her tenure in that position, she was instrumental in developing The Guidelines for Performance-Based Professional School Counselor Evaluation as well as a major revision of the Missouri Comprehensive Guidance Program Manual. Her leadership also helped bring to fruition the Missouri Standards for Teacher Education Programs in School Counseling. In addition, she helped develop a web site for Guidance and Placement at the state level as well as a list-serve for counselors across the state to be able to communicate with one another

Dr. Bunch has worked closely with Dr. Norman Gysbers, developer of the Missouri Guidance Program and past presidents of both the American Personnel and Guidance Association and National Vocational Guidance Association.

Dr. Bunch is a Licensed Professional Counselor in Missouri, and is recognized as a National Certified Counselor. She has a Ph.D. in School Psychology with an emphasis in educational and family systems from the University of Missouri—Columbia, and a Master's Degree in School Counseling from Pittsburg State University.

Dr. Bunch has been actively involved in numerous professional organizations and has assumed many leadership roles. She presently serves on the Missouri School Counselor Association Governing Board and Program Committee as Advertising Co-Chair. She has also served on the Missouri Association for Career and Technical Education Program Committee representing Guidance and Special Needs. In addition, she serves as the Chair of the Multicultural Issues Committee for the Guidance Division of the national Association for Career and Technical Education.

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**Dawn S. Szymanski, PhD.**, is also a new faculty member in the Community Counseling area and is considered one of the top doctoral graduates (2001) in the field of counseling. She earned her B.A. in Psychology and Sociology from the State University of New York at Fredonia, M.S. in Agency Counseling from Indiana State University, and her Ed.S. in Community Counseling and Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology from Georgia State University. Dr. Szymanski's theoretical orientation is primarily an integration of feminist, family systems, interpersonal, and cognitive-behavioral therapy. Her counseling experiences include working with college students at university counseling centers, children and families in therapeutic foster care, pregnant teenagers, the developmentally disabled, children and adolescents in group homes and residential treatment centers, victims of rape and battering, and crisis hotlines.

In terms of teaching, Dr. Szymanski has taught graduate classes in research methods, cognitive behavioral therapy, marital and family therapy, and counseling skills. This fall she will be teaching the CE 485: Community Counseling Practicum and CE 414: Individual Inventory. Dr. Szymanski's research interests are primarily in the areas of: (a) feminist therapy and supervision, (b) lesbian, gay, and bisexual issues, (c) multicultural counseling, and (d) counselor education and research training.

Dr. Szymanski is currently actively involved as an editorial board member for the American College Counseling Association's (ACCA) (A division of the American Counseling Association (ACA)) *Journal of College Counseling* and as an ad hoc reviewer for the *Psychology of Women Quarterly*, *Journal of Lesbian Studies*, and *Sex Roles*. She is also a member of the American Psychological Association's (APA) Division's 17 (Society for Counseling Psychology) and 35 (Division on Women) Interdivisional Task Force to develop guidelines for counseling/psychotherapy with women as well as being Newsletter Editor for the APA Division 17 Section for the Advancement of Women.

On a personal note, she and her partner moved here from Atlanta, GA a few weeks ago and are settling in nicely. "In my spare time, I enjoy spending time with my two dogs, Jason & Peanut, gardening, cooking, building dollhouses, exercising, listening to music, and yoga. I am very excited to be here and look forward to meeting and working with many of you. I also wanted to congratulate you on your recent CACREP accreditation! This is no easy feat to accomplish and provides evidence of your solid training program. 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### Division of Counseling & Family Therapy "In the News"

**Dr. Mark Pope**, Associate Professor, was elected American Counseling Association President for 2003-2004, received the Robert Swan Lifetime Achievement in Career Development Award from the California Career Development Association, and was elected Fellow of both the National Career Development Association and the American Psychological Association's Division 17 (Society for Counseling Psychology). He has been featured prominently on KMOX radio and in such publications as the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, Vital Voice, and on the webpage of UM-St. Louis and in the Current (UM St. Louis' student newspaper).

**Dr. Dawn Szymanski**, Assistant Professor, received the 2002 APA Division 35 (Psychology of Women) Psychotherapy with Women Award for her paper entitled, "*The Feminist Supervision Scale (FSS): A Rational/Theoretical Approach.*" This award is funded through the generosity of Drs. Annette Brodsky and Rachel Hare-Mustin and from the royalties of their classic book, *Women and Psychotherapy: An Assessment of Research and Practice*.

**Dr. Rocco Cottone**, Professor, has completed the revision of his ethics text, coauthored with Vilia Tarvydas at the University of Iowa, *Ethical and Professional Issues in Counseling* (2003, Merrill/Prentice Hall). The first edition got excellent reviews, and he is hopeful that the new edition also is well received and reader friendly. Students who have comments about the ethics text (or recommendations for future editions) should direct them to **Dr. Cottone**. Also, **Dr. Cottone** has been appointed to the American Counseling Association Ethics Code Rewrite Task Force, which is charged with revising the ethics code for professional counselors. He'll begin work on the task force in 2002. **Dr. Cottone** also appeared on a variety of news venues (including KMOV-TV) during the "Jerry Lewis Muscular Dystrophy Telethon." Dr. Cottone's son, Tori, has a form of MD.

**Dr. S. Kent Butler**, Assistant Professor, recently presented on a historic panel consisting of some of the most highly recognized and distinguished African Americans in the Counseling profession. This panel was presented at the 2002 American Counseling Association national convention in New Orleans and, along with **Dr. Butler**, included Dr. Courtland Lee and Dr. Thomas Parham. The panel discussed issues surrounding mentorship and the role of new professionals in the field of Counseling. **Dr. Nicholas A. Vacc**, 62 died on June 8, 2002, at Moses Cone Hospital. He was the Joe Rosenthal Excellence Professor and past chairperson of the Department of Counseling and Educational development at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. During his tenure as chair, the department was selected as the Outstanding Counselor Education Program in 1991 and 1994. He served as president of the Association for Assessment in Counseling, editor of the Measurement and Evaluation in Counseling and Development journal, and president of Chi Sigma Iota International, the international counseling honor society.
