A Program Tailored to your Career Aspirations

We designed the BES for a leadership career in educational settings that are outside the traditional classroom. Flexibility is built in to the program, allowing you to choose emphasis areas and tailor your coursework to align with your career aspirations. Upon graduating with a Bachelor of Educational Studies, you will have earned:

- A minimum of 120 credit hours, with 42 hours of general education courses
- An approved content minor or a certificate relevant to the student's goals
- Successful completion of career related internships, totaling 15 hours

Program Requirements

The BES degree program is open to any student interested in a non-teacher certification professional education degree and who meets the University of Missouri—St. Louis GPA requirement. Students are encouraged to consider this program to meet their future career interests or academic requirements.




